About UAPD

- Over 60 uniformed, sworn Arizona state peace officers
- Patrol on and off campus 24 hours a day.
- Respond to calls for service (911 or nonemergency).
- Enforce all applicable state laws & UA Code of Conduct.





- Conduct investigations, issues citations and/or make arrests.
- Refer students to Dean of Students Office regarding violation of Code of Conduct.
- Available as a resource to students, faculty, staff and visitors.

SITUATIONAL AWARENESS



White	Unprepared and unready to take action.
Yellow	Prepared, alert & relaxed. Good situational awareness.
Orange	Alert to probable danger. Ready to take action.
Red	Action Mode. Focused on the emergency at hand.
Black	Panic. Breakdown of physical & mental performance.







SITUATIONAL AWARENESS



- AVOID DISTRACTIONS
 - Especially when traveling.
 - Includes smartphones & headphones.
- PAY ATTENTION TO YOUR SURROUNDINGS
 - Constantly scan the area.
 - Watch for threats and/or hazards.
 - Trust your instincts.

- DON'T BE A TARGET
 - Hide valuables.
 - Keep control of property.

- **SAFETY IN NUMBERS**
 - Stay in groups.
 - Stay near populated areas.







BUILDING SECURITY



- Avoid Tailgating.
- Make sure doors properly close & lock behind you.
- Report damage & malfunctioning property IMMEDIATELY.
- Report suspicious persons or items to UAPD IMMEDIATELY.









- No Weapons on Campus:
 - All firearms.
 - Explosives, including fireworks.
 - Knives blades longer than 5 inches
 - LE-grade chemical irritants or electrical devices









- Allowed DEFENSIVE tools:
 - OTC chemical repellants (mace).
 - OTC electroshock devices.
 - Batons 26" or less.
 - Keyring defense tools.







- No Tobacco products:
 - Including vapes.
 - On all UA property, including public areas like the mall.











- No Electric Scooters
- Marijuana-free campus
- Violations are NOT a crime!









DE-ESCALATION & DIFFICULT PEOPLE

- REMAIN CALM
 - Tone mirroring
 - Don't argue/yell
- EMPATHIZE & ENGAGE
 - Can diffuse situations
 - Buy time for help
- BODY LANGUAGE & MOVEMENT
 - Clenching fists
 - Squaring off
 - Reaching into bag or pockets

- GET OTHERS INVOLVED
 - Safety in numbers
 - Call for help if needed
- ASK THEM TO LEAVE
- CONTACT POLICE IMMEDIATELY!
 - Violent action
 - Threats
 - Refuse to leave







SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY VS. CRIME

- SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY NOT NECESSARILY A CRIME
 - Behavior which indicates person MAY BE involved in crime
 - Location
 - Behavior
 - Unusual or inappropriate clothing or possession
- THREAT Action or words which cause fear of injury or damage.
 - Explicit VS. Implicit
 - Access & Means
 - Can you walk away?







RESPONDING TO CRIME/ACTIVE THREAT

REMAIN CALM

- Keep everyone else calm
- Don't escalate the situation
- Helps you & police

FIGHT OR FLIGHT

- Avoid confrontation
- Fight as LAST RESORT
- Don't follow or detain
- Assume weapons

SAFETY FIRST!

- Is it safe to stick around?
- Location, location, location
- Are you alone?

GET HELP!

- Call 9-1-1 IMMEDIATELY
- Only if safe to do so
- Make 9-1-1 your FIRST CALL!







RESPONDING TO CRIME/ACTIVE THREAT (cont.)

- BE A GOOD WITNESS!
 - Physical description(s)
 - Direction of travel
 - Vehicles or on foot
 - Weapon(s)
- CALLING 9-1-1
 - Give location first
 - Type of crime/incident
 - ID yourself
 - Injuries?
 - Answer all questions

- WAIT FOR POLICE
 - If it's safe
 - Evidence & witnesses
 - Answer questions







IN CASE OF EMERGENCY





CALL

IF YOU CAN

TEXT

IF YOU CAN'T



TEXT-TO-911

- OPEN a new text message. No other app required.
- TYPE 9-1-1 in the "To" field.
- KEEP IT SHORT. First message should be location & type of emergency services needed.
- CALL 9-1-1 if you can. This does NOT replace phone calls.

USE TEXT-TO-911 WHEN:

- You have speech or hearing impairment.
- You can't speak due to injury or illness.
- Talking on the phone is a threat to your safety.
- You are in an area with poor reception.


IN CASE OF EMERGENCY

Emergency Blue Light Phones

- Over 200 across campus.
- Connect directly to UAPD Dispatch.
- Exterior phones have blue light, so visible at night.


